Discover Hanoi City Walk

Ngũ Xã Bronze-Casting Village and Đền Quán Thánh – The Temple of Trấn Vũ, Protector of the North

Saturday, 2 April, 9:30 AM – 12:30 PM (English)

Learn about bronze casting and its history in Northern Việt Nam, visit a "kitchen" foundry, see the largest single pour bronze statue in the nation—all on tiny Ngũ Xã Island on the east end of Hồ Trúc Bạch. Then walk with us to discover Đền Quán Thánh, the very important, old, almost purely Taoist temple and its 3.7-ton 350-year-old bronze statue of Trấn Vũ, Hà Nội's Protector of the North. On the way, learn about the history of Hồ Trúc Bạch.

Discover Hanoi City Walk

We will visit a communal house and pagoda, the famous Bạch Mã Temple, and the house where Hồ Chí Minh drafted the Declaration of Independence.

"Sandy Lives" Thursday, 14 April, 7:30 – 9:30 PM (Vietnamese with English subtitles)





For twenty years, Canh has lived in North Việt Nam, unable to return to his home in the south, a small fishing village where his wife Thoa waits for him. She has been a guerrilla fighter for the triumphant communist forces and has made a living selling food in the market. She is happy to reunite with her husband until she learns that he has married a young woman in the north and has a child by her. The love triangle becomes more complicated: Huy, a man who has lost a leg is in love with Thoa, who does not return his affection; and there is Hao, a young woman who has lost both legs and who is in love with Huy. All of the characters' emotional injuries are as deep as those of Huy and Hao, but they behave with great kindness towards one another. The movie was made for USD \$36,000, but the lack of special effects allows us to concentrate on the difficulties of reunification and of finding both political and psychic peace.

Winner of national prizes: Golden Lotus for Best Picture, Best Director, and Best actress; Asia Pacific Film Festival for Best Actress, Best Supporting Actress, Best Director, and Best Film; and Special Prize, Amiens International Film Festival.

Music Section Concert and Museum Visit at the Vietnam Institute of Musicology Sunday, 17 April, 9:00 – 11:30 AM (English) *Note: Transportation options below

Back by popular demand following last year's interesting event, the Vietnam Institute for Musicology (VIM) has agreed to organize a special visit for Friends of Vietnam Heritage (FVH). The VIM is a government research institute which promotes an understanding and appreciation of the music of all the ethnic groups in Việt Nam. They have a large collection of musical instruments, their own recording studios and a research staff of specialist musicologists.

The VIM art group will introduce some unique Vietnamese musical instruments in 3 parts: Firstly, all the musicians will open the event with a Chingkram performance of the Giarai ethnic group.

Secondly, the institute will present the extraordinary traditional instruments of eight of Việt Nam's diverse ethnic groups, including the stunning đàn tranh (a 16 chord instrument); the romantic Sáo trúc (Bamboo flute); and seven string and percussion instruments. Have you ever played a Vietnamese banjo (Đàn nguyệt)? This is your opportunity.

Finally, the concert will finish with some traditional singing and evocative folk songs to the accompaniment of these instruments. Participants will be treated to Ca trù singing: a tradition that has been accorded World Heritage status by UNESCO. The grand finale will be a Mường gong concert, performed by all the artists

The street is not numbered yet, but the Institute has a huge sign above the entrance to the center building: Viện Âm nhạc Việt Nam Hà Nội. For those choosing public transportation, the bus number 50 starts at Long Biên bus station, then proceeds westward on Yên Phụ and turns left to go southbound on Thanh Niên, then turns left again to go eastward on Phan Đình Phùng, then right to go southbound on Hoàng Diệu, the road by the citadel, then continues on to go down Kim Mã and turns left at the Daewoo Hotel to go south on Nguyễn Chí Thanh, which takes you to the new Hanoi Museum, then on to the Institute. Other buses in the area are: 5, 29, 33, 39, and 44 all of which go just to the corner of Đường Phạm Hùng and Đường Mẫ Trì, about 3 blocks walk from the Institute.

Douglas Jardine, a professor at Hanoi University, will continue his series of monthly lectures with an illustrated talk about the Red City —the influence of the former Soviet Union on Hà Nội's city landscape. This lecture explores the impact of the friendship between the Soviet Union and Việt Nam on the cityscape of Hà Nội. From monumental architecture to public housing and city planning the ideology of these partners attempted to build the ideal socialist city. We will explore how Soviet architects and planners, such as Iaskovich and Sokolov, influenced Hà Nội and were in turn influenced themselves by their experience in Việt Nam.

A Talk by Dr Mark Rapoport: "Shamanism in the Northern Mountains of Việt Nam" Wednesday, 20 April, 26 April, 6:30 – 8:00 PM (English)

Shamanism—the backbone of Tribal Culture. Join us as Dr Mark Rapoport discusses the tribal groups of Northern Việt Nam and the persistence of their shamanisms traditions. The talk will focus on the importance of the old and new artifacts, paintings and ceremonial tools used by the shamans. Mark will also discuss the practice and ethics of being a collector of these fascinating objects.

We have a lot of expertise here. Mark is an avid collector of the tribal art of Việt Nam (and Africa). His own substantial collection includes many paintings and tools used by tribal groups residing from Thái Nguyên to the mountains of the China border. Mark, along with business partner Nguyen Thi Nhung and the 54 Traditions Gallery staff, have assembled and prepared exhibits at two major museums in Hà Nội, as well as at the East-West Institute in Honolulu, Hawaii, USA.

under six are free. This fee is in addition to the regular museum entrance fee and goes directly to the puppet troupe. After the performances there are opportunities to talk to the artisans about traditional puppetry in Việt Nam. The performance is held in the outdoor exhibition space. Special performance for private parties and events can be arranged.

<u>The Hanoi Museum</u> Phạm Hùng Street, Từ Liêm

The first two floors of the Hanoi Museum house a permanent collection of bronzes, photos, plants, pottery and miscellaneous artifacts, along with a small cafe and shop. At the entrance to the second floor exhibits there is magnificent silk embroidery. The third and fourth floors currently display an extensive temporary collection of ceramic pieces from 1000BC to the 20th Century, Đông Sơn drums and both metal and stone tools.



This new museum is completely wheelchair accessible. There is a ramp on the left of the stairs leading to the front door and a circular ramp spirals to each of the four floors. There is also an elevator.

Items are labeled in both Vietnamese and English and are well lit and displayed. Groups are welcome.

Sculpture Exhibition from Three Continents



The exhibition is the work results of the Vietnamese Sculpture Group 5+ (Lê Thị Hiền, Mai Thu Vân, Lê Lang Lương, Khổng Đỗ Tuyền, Trần Trọng Tri, and Nguyễn Ngọc Lâm) with Belgian sculpture artists Paty Sonville and Talbaui Faima, and an American sculpture artist Ushida. The works belong to a program for artists residing in Việt Nam with the cooperation between the Vietnam Art Association and Wallonie-Bruxelles International.

To make the works, firstly the artists had to learn about traditional techniques of sculpture and bamboo, and then they combined these materials to create the different sculpture works depending on the artists' creativity and research. Through diverse materials and techniques, the project aims to make an art sculpture work in space, and each artist will reflect in his own language with the topic, "A House in Cubes." The project is a new experience for each artist. Moreover, this is also an opportunity to develop creative directions of sculptural art through international exchange, and among artists and art associations.

Special Exhibition: "Single Mothers' Voices"

The Women's Museum of Vietnam has cooperated with the Embassy of the Republic of Finland to mount an exhibit, "Single Mothers' Voices." Twenty single mothers from Tấn Minh Commune in Sóc Sơn District, Hà Nội received training and cameras to photograph themselves, their lives, and subjects of importance to them. The 100 images introduced in this exhibit have been chosen from the 1,000 photographs the women took. The exhibit also displays portraits of 18 single mothers. Here are true stories, words shared from lives of women with "one shoulder but two yokes" for these women must serve as both mother and father yet must also overcome fixed gender prejudices and low self-image to achieve happiness. This exhibit also shows the change in the community's perceptions and actions regarding the issue of single women. It invites each of us to join hands to eradicate every hindrance and prejudice and to participate in realizing the goal of equality. The exhibition runs until August 2011.

1. Bạch Mã Temple Guidebook (White Horse Temple)

Learn about King Lý Thái Tổ's dream and why the temple honors the White Horse Deity. This guidebook offers detailed information on the history of Bach Mã Temple on Hàng Buôm Street, including temple layout, translation of panels written in Chinese characters, as well as information about the symbolism used in the temple. The guided walk contained at the end of this guidebook provides an opportunity to explore and experience some of the same streets where the craft guilds and merchants set-up within the third enclosure of the citadel.

2. Quán Thánh Temple Guidebook

This publication details the legends of Huyền Thiên Trấn Vũ, also known as the 'genie who guards the Dark Heaven.' This guidebook contains detailed information on the history of Quán Thánh Temple, as well as translations of the many parallel sentences and poems on the walls and columns of this magnificent Taoist Temple. A walking tour of the bronze-casting village of Ngũ Xã, with its Chùa and Đình and the enjoyable atmosphere around Trúc Bạch Lake is included.

3. Trấn Quốc Pagoda Guidebook

The Trấn Quốc Pagoda on Thanh Niên Road was founded some 1400 years ago, and it is one of the most ancient Buddhist pagodas in Hà Nội. Nestled between West Lake and Trúc Bạch Lake, the pagoda is considered a magnificent symbol of Buddhism in Việt Nam, and is one of the most visited sites in the capital. This guidebook covers the history of Buddhism, the temple layout, and describes in detail the different areas of the pagoda. A fascinating publication, which includes especially commissioned drawings and photographs.

4. Phủ Tây Hồ Guidebook (West Lake Palace)

Have you ever wondered who these doll-like statues in glass cabinets, in blue, white, red or green attire may be? Phủ Tây Hồ at the far end of the Tây Hồ peninsula is the most impressive pagoda dedicated to the cult of the Mother goddesses in Hà Nội, an indigenous cult that seems to permeate the lives of all Vietnamese women in varying degrees. The guidebook describes in detail the complex itself, then discusses the religion of the Mother goddesses, including its philosophy, pantheon and rituals. **Published 2004**

5. Lãn Ông Street Guidebook (Traditional Medicine Street)

Traditional medicine is very much alive on this particular street of the Old Quarter. This guidebook not only describes the area in its historical context and current set-up, but also offers information on a variety of Vietnamese herbal teas for the health conscious as well as a comprehensive pictorial of Lãn Ông Street. *Published 2005, reprinted 2005*



6. Bát Tràng Traditional Pottery Village: A Self-Guided Walk

This guidebook focuses on the old section of the pottery commune of Bát Tràng, a village with a long history hitherto unknown to many outsiders. The guidebook is based on a self-guided walk. There are three different circuits lasting from 45 minutes to two hours, all shown on a map. *Published 2006, reprinted 2009*

7. Hoàn Kiếm Lake, its Legends and Temples: A Self-Guided Walk

The area around Hồ Hoàn Kiếm represents the physical heart and spiritual soul of Hà Nội. Continuing the tradition of FVH to promote the understanding of Việt Nam's history and culture, this guidebook focuses on the history and legends, the temples and pagodas surrounding the lake. Also included is information on the large Báo Ân Pagoda complex, which was razed between 1886-1889 and left only the Hòa Phong tower still standing today. **Published 2007**

8. Vignettes of French Culture in Hà Nội

This guidebook provides an insight and appreciation of the influence on Hà Nội of the French colonial period from 1873 until 1954. The three guided walks contained in this guidebook provide an opportunity for the reader to explore and experience aspects of what the people of Hà Nội have absorbed and made their own as a result of eighty years of French presence in their city.

9. Hồ Tây – Walks Around West Lake

Hồ Tây continues to inspired writers, artists and photographers with its beauty, history, culture and religious aspects, but it also provides for its local residents a source of fish, water and a rich soil to cultivate a variety of plants and vegetables. This guidebook covers the legends of the lake, as well as its history and future plans for this rapidly expanding part of Hà Nội. Included are five self-guided walks identifying those places of interest both old and new around the entire West Lake shore.

10. Văn Miếu Walking Tour (Temple of Literature)

This guidebook introduces visitors to the Văn Miễu, or the Temple of Literature, one of the foremost architectural treasures of Việt Nam and its capital city Hà Nội. The Văn Miếu - Quốc Tử Giám ranks third in Việt Nam's register of national historic sites. A leafy oasis in the centre of the bustling city, it is a magnet for the citizens of Hà Nội and for visitors to the city who wish to spend a quiet moment contemplating its rich past. This guidebook contains a history of the school and the temple, a description of each courtyard and its meaning as expressed through its architecture, translations of all the plaques, as well as quick guides to Confucianism and the Royal Examinations

The Friends of Vietnam Heritage's Resource Center is on the 4th floor of the Hanoi City Library (Thư Viện Hà Nội), located on the corner of Trần Hưng Đạo and Bà Triệu streets. The FVH collection includes books and journals that focus on Vietnamese art, history and culture.

In order to access the collection you need to get a Reader's Card. Go to the office (just inside the main entrance of the library), fill out a simple form, and attach one photograph. You'll also need to show your passport and pay an annual fee of 22,000 VND. After becoming a member, show your card whenever you go in.

The FVH collection is for reference only. You cannot remove the books from the



library. Please note that the Reader's Card does not authorize the holder to borrow other books from the main library. If you want a Borrower's Card for checking out non-FVH books, you will need to fill out another form to receive one.

Library Opening Times: Every day Monday to Friday except Thursday morning of the first and third week of the month. Daily times: 8:00 AM – 12:00 PM and 1:30 – 5:00 PM. Closed on weekends and national holidays.
