These three innovative films are part of a Ford Foundation community-based media project involving staff from both the Vietnam Museum of Ethnology and VTV5. Project participants worked with 3 diverse communities in Hanoi to help them find and express the stories they wanted to tell in their own voices.

The three communities are: young yeople who live to hip hop dance, a group of university utudents

who work as home tutors, and women recyclers from Nam Định Province who come to Hanoi to earn a living by trading scrap. Some community members and project participants will be present to share their experiences of creating these films.

<u>Arts & Antiquities:</u> "Tribal Textile as Identity, Technology and History" A lecture by Dr Mark Rapoport Wednesday, 16 November, 6:00 – 7:30 PM (English)



Many of the people of Vietnam's ethnic minorities are immediately identifiable by the costume and textile they wear. In fact, most wear their identities for all to see—all day and every day: pants, skirts, belts, turbans and jewellery. Dr. Mark Rapoport, an avid collector of Ethno-linguistic (tribal) textiles, will give us insights into the technology of creating textiles as a tangible witness to a group's history. More importantly, the design elements are an expression of many facets of each individual's identity, mirroring their group, their gender, and marital status, but still leaving enough

flexibility to allow for individual expression.

Food for the Body and Soul: the Lotus Thursday, 17 November, 10:00 AM - 12:30 PM (English)

« Food shall be Thy medicine », Hippocrate said and the Vietnamese practice it. The lotus was chosen by the Buddha as the symbol of his teaching, as it has flowers and fruits, all at the same time. This means that if we choose to live according to correct principles, we will see the results in our lives instantly. You will discuss with Chi Nguyễn, MD, doctor in Western medicine as well as the four principal domains of traditional Asian medicine: energetic work out or Qi Gong, acupuncture/acupressure, food and emotions.



After learning about the role of the lotus in Vietnamese food, we will have some delicacies served by the O Chao Tea House, together with an explanation about the benefits of drinking tea.

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<u>Discover Hanoi City Walk:</u> Ngũ Xã Bronze Casting Village and Đền Quán Thánh – the temple of Trấn Vũ, Protector of the North

Saturday, 19 November, 9:30 AM - 12:30 PM (this walk often takes a bit more time) (English)

Learn about bronze casting and its history in northern Vietnam, visit a "kitchen" foundry, see the largest single pour bronze statue in Vietnam – all on tiny Ngũ Xã island on the east end of Hồ Trúc Bạch. Then, walk with us to discover Đền Quán Thánh, the very important, old, almost purely Taoist temple and its 3.7-ton 350-year-old bronze statue of Trấn Vũ, Hanoi's Protector of the North. On the way, learn about the history of Hồ Trúc Bạch.

Main duties:

Work with retailers to ensure FVH guidebooks are displayed prominently and are in good condition. Liaise with FVH Section Heads to ensure adequate stock is available for sale during their activities. Occasionally deliver gift items
- Submit monthly activity/accounting report to the Executive Committee. When possible, attend monthly Governing Council meeting (usually held on the first Tuesday of each month)
- Mentor an alternate Coordinator as a future replacement or as an additional team member in order to distributions efforts

Water Puppets: Performances every Saturday and Sunday at 10:00 AM, 11:30 AM, 2:30 PM and 4:00 PM. Show tickets are 20,000 VND for adults, 10,000 VND for children, children under six are free. After the performances there are opportunities to talk to the artisans about traditional puppetry in Việt Nam. The performance is held in the outdoor exhibition space. <u>The Hanoi Museum</u> Bảo Tàng Hà Nội

Phạm Hùng Street, Từ Liêm

The first two floors of the Hanoi Museum house a permanent collection of bronzes, photos, plants, pottery and miscellaneous artifacts, along with a small cafe and shop. At the entrance to the second floor exhibits there is magnificent silk embroidery. The third and fourth floors are still under development but currently display an extensive temporary collection of ceramic pieces from 1000BC to the 20th Century, Đông Sơn drums and both metal and stone tools.

This new museum is completely wheelchair accessible. There is a ramp on the left of the stairs leading to the front door and a circular ramp spirals to each of the four floors. There is also an elevator.



Items are labeled in both Vietnamese and English and are well lit and displayed. Groups are welcome.

Sculpture Exhibition from Three Continents

The exhibition is the work results of the Vietnamese Sculpture Group 5+ (Lê Thị Hiền, Mai Thu Vân, Lê Lang Lương, Khổng Đỗ Tuyền, Trần Trọng Tri, and Nguyễn Ngọc Lâm) with Belgian sculpture artists Paty Sonville and Talbaui Faima, and an American sculpture artist Ushida. The works belong to a program for artists residing in Việt Nam with the cooperation between the Vietnam Art Association and Wallonie-Bruxelles International.

To make the works, firstly the artists had to learn about traditional techniques of sculpture and bamboo, and then they combined these materials to create the different sculpture works depending on the artists' creativity and research. Through diverse materials and techniques, the project aims to make an art sculpture work in space, and each artist will reflect in his own language with the topic, "A House in Cubes." The project is a new experience for each artist. Moreover, this is also an opportunity to develop creative directions of sculptural art through international exchange, and among artists and art associations.

1. Bạch Mã Temple Guidebook (White Horse Temple)

Learn about King Lý Thái Tổ's dream and why the temple honors the White Horse Deity. This guidebook offers detailed information on the history of Bạch Mã Temple on Hàng Buồm Street, including temple layout, translation of panels written in Chinese characters, as well as information about the symbolism used in the temple. The guided walk contained at the end of this guidebook provides an opportunity to explore and experience some of the same streets where the craft guilds and merchants set-up within the third enclosure of the citadel.

2. Quán Thánh Temple Guidebook

This publication details the legends of Huyền Thiên Trấn Vũ, also known as the 'genie who guards the Dark Heaven.' This guidebook contains detailed information on the history of Quán Thánh Temple, as well as translations of the many parallel sentences and poems on the walls and columns of this magnificent Taoist Temple. A walking tour of the bronze-casting village of Ngũ Xã, with its Chùa and Đình and the enjoyable atmosphere around Trúc Bạch Lake is included. **Published 2002, reprinted 2008**

3. Trấn Quốc Pagoda Guidebook

The Trấn Quốc Pagoda on Thanh Niên Road was founded some 1400 years ago, and it is one of the most ancient Buddhist pagodas in Hà Nội. Nestled between West Lake and Trúc Bạch Lake, the pagoda is considered a magnificent symbol of Buddhism in Việt Nam, and is one of the most visited sites in the capital. This guidebook covers the history of Buddhism, the temple layout, and describes in detail the different areas of the pagoda. A fascinating publication, which includes especially commissioned drawings and photographs.

4. Phủ Tây Hồ Guidebook (West Lake Palace)

Have you ever wondered who these doll-like statues in glass cabinets, in blue, white, red or green attire may be? Phủ Tây Hồ at the far end of the Tây Hồ peninsula is the most impressive pagoda dedicated to the cult of the Mother goddesses in Hà Nội, an indigenous cult that seems to permeate the lives of all Vietnamese women in varying degrees. The guidebook describes in detail the complex itself, then discusses the religion of the Mother goddesses, including its philosophy, pantheon and rituals. **Published 2004**

5. Lãn Ông Street Guidebook (Traditional Medicine Street)

Traditional medicine is very much alive on this particular street of the Old Quarter. This guidebook not only describes the area in its historical context and current set-up, but also offers information on a variety of Vietnamese herbal teas for the health conscious as well as a comprehensive pictorial of Lãn Ông Street. **Published 2005, reprinted 2005**

6. Bát Tràng Traditional Pottery Village: A Self-Guided Walk

This guidebook focuses on the old section of the pottery commune of Bát Tràng, a village with a long history hitherto unknown to many outsiders. The guidebook is based on a self-guided walk. There are three different circuits lasting from 45 minutes to two hours, all shown on a map. **Published 2006, reprinted 2009**

7. Hoàn Kiếm Lake, its Legends and Temples: A Self-Guided Walk

The area around Hồ Hoàn Kiếm represents the physical heart and spiritual soul of Hà Nội. Continuing the tradition of FVH to promote the understanding of Việt Nam's history and culture, this guidebook focuses on the history and legends, the temples and pagodas surrounding the lake. Also included is information on the large Báo Ân Pagoda complex, which was razed between 1886-1889 and left only the Hòa Phong tower still standing today. **Published 2007**

8. Vignettes of French Culture in Hà Nội

This guidebook provides an insight and appreciation of the influence on Hà Nội of the French colonial period from 1873 until 1954. The three guided walks contained in this guidebook provide an opportunity for the reader to explore and experience aspects of what the people of Hà Nội have absorbed and made their own as a result of eighty years of French presence in their city. **Published 2008**

9. Hồ Tây – Walks Around West Lake

Hồ Tây continues to inspired writers, artists and photographers with its beauty, history, culture and religious aspects, but it also provides for its local residents a source of fish, water and a rich soil to cultivate a variety of plants and vegetables. This guidebook covers the legends of the lake, as well as its history and future plans for this rapidly expanding part of Hà Nội. Included are five self-guided walks identifying those places of interest both old and new around the entire West Lake shore.

10. Văn Miếu Walking Tour (Temple of Literature)

This guidebook introduces visitors to the Văn Miễu, or the Temple of Literature, one of the foremost architectural treasures of Việt Nam and its capital city Hà Nội. The Văn Miếu - Quốc Tử Giám ranks third in Việt Nam's register of national historic sites. A leafy oasis in the centre of the bustling city, it is a magnet for the citizens of Hà Nội and for visitors to the city who wish to spend a quiet moment contemplating its rich past. This guidebook contains a history of the school and the temple, a description of each courtyard and its meaning as expressed through its architecture, translations of all the plaques, as well as quick quides to Confucianism and the Royal Examinations

The Friends of Vietnam Heritage's Resource Center is on the 4th floor of the Hanoi City Library (Thư Viện Hà Nội), located on the corner of Trần Hưng Đạo and Bà Triệu streets. The FVH collection includes books and journals that focus on Vietnamese art, history and culture.

In order to access the collection you need to get a Reader's Card. Go to the office (just inside the main entrance of the library), fill out a simple form, and attach one photograph. You'll also need to show your passport and pay an annual fee of 22,000 VND. After becoming a member, show your card whenever you go in.



The FVH collection is for reference only. You cannot remove the books from the library. Please note that the Reader's Card does not authorize the holder to borrow other books from the main library. If you want a Borrower's Card for checking out non-FVH books, you will need to fill out another form to receive one.

Library Opening Times: Every day Monday to Friday except Thursday morning of the first and third week of the month. Daily times: 8:00 AM – 12:00 PM and 1:30 – 5:00 PM. Closed on weekends and national holidays.
