Vietnam: The Next Generation

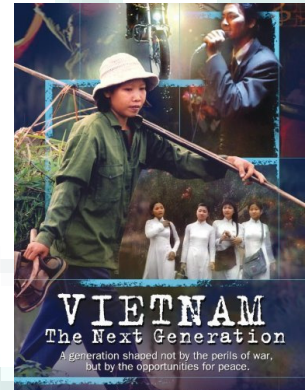

Thirty years ago, the only future that awaited young Vietnamese was war. But how have those born in the war's aftermath capitalized on the dividends of peace? The final film in **Sandy Northrop's** trilogy on Vietnam today, **VIETNAM: The Next Generation** profiles the lives of seven young Vietnamese, revealing the challenges, choices and dreams that shape their lives, and that of their generation.

Vietnam's first post-war generation is coming of age, and its members—now in their 20s and 30s—are seizing opportunities unimaginable in their parents' time. Communism is losing its relevancy, the doors of a free-market economy are opening and memories of the war are being relegated to the distant past. This generation, representing 80 percent of Vietnam's population, is making up for lost time, exploring all the benefits and costs of their country's new economic and cultural future.



The same young Vietnamese who once might have stood in line clutching ration coupons for their family's rice allotment—people like refugee-turned-entrepreneur A Lan Dương and American-raised businessman Henry Nguyễn—now believe that living standards will be better tomorrow than they are today. Many start on a second college degree before they have completed the first. They finish their day jobs as waiters and head off for evening school to study English. Like voice student and newlywed Trần Minh Đăng, they flood into the cities from the countryside—15,000 of them each month—and the money they send back to their villages keeps millions of families off poverty's doorstep.

Yet prosperity is nowhere close to reaching all young Vietnamese. **VIETNAM: The Next Generation** also follows construction engineer Lê Việt Tiến, who works to rebuild the Hồ Chí Minh Highway far from his wife and newborn child; Phạm Văn Vinh and his sister Loan, two of the thousands of children living on the streets of Hồ Chí Minh City; and Lê Thị Phượng, a rural farmer who lost a leg in a landmine accident and now struggles as the sole supporter of her entire family.

Lecture & Excursion:

Rice growing – Hanoi Agriculture University

Saturday, 16 June, 7:30 AM - 3:00 PM

Have you ever wondered about the process of growing rice – the staple of Vietnamese life? Have you ever wanted to get down into the paddy field and see what rice plants really look like? In our visit to the Hanoi Agriculture University, Dr. Phạm Văn Cường and his students will introduce us to the many facets of rice cultivation and its cultural importance in all aspects of Vietnamese life. From the seedling stage to harvesting and threshing, we will be able to experience the whole process in the trial fields and glass greenhouses. The students will show us their experimental rice plots, highlighting some different rice types, different rates of fertilizers, etc.



The students have also prepared planting and harvesting beds for us to practice some agrarian skills – so please don't wear your best clothes! Children are welcome to try their hands in the mud also! There's plenty of rice to harvest. Please bring your own snack or lunch as we will not be back in Hanoi in time for lunch. You will need to take off your shoes before getting into the paddy, so we recommend sandals of some sort. We will provide plenty of bottled water and it will be useful to have a hat, umbrella for walking around the fields – it is usually pretty hot and sunny at this time of the year. Sunscreen too!

Guidebook Coordinator

A newly created position within Friends of Vietnam Heritage, the aim of the Guidebook Coordinator is to improve the distribution of FVH guidebooks with the help of Thế Giới Publishers and FVH's Publishing Committee. The ideal candidate will be a volunteer who is knowledgeable in marketing and methods to increase sales and visibility of FVH's guidebooks, which are currently on sale at such locations as Bookworm, Văn Miếu, and various museum gift shops. The Coordinator will receive ample training to answer FVH questions during sales meetings and to present the FVH guidebook series. The Coordinator will be encouraged to help grow this position so it meets the evolving needs of the organization.

Main duties:

- Promotion, sales and marketing – Introduce FVH guidebooks to appropriate Hà Nội-area retailers and build on-going sales relationships. Present and discuss the guidebooks with interested groups and give presentations at FVH events
- Distribution – Monitor inventory at sales locations, replace stock as needed, and deliver new publications in a timely manner. Work with retailers to ensure FVH guidebooks are displayed prominently and are in good condition. Liaise with FVH Section Heads to ensure adequate stock is available for sale during their activities. Occasionally deliver gift items
- Submit monthly activity/accounting report to the Executive Committee. When possible, attend monthly Governing Council meeting (usually held on the first Tuesday of each month)
- Mentor an alternate Coordinator as a future replacement or as an additional team member in order to expand sales and distributions efforts

Water Puppets: Performances every Saturday and Sunday at 10:00 AM, 11:30 AM, 2:30 PM and 4:00 PM. Show tickets are 20,000 VND for adults, 10,000 VND for children, children under six are free. This fee is in addition to the regular museum entrance fee and goes directly to the puppet troupe. After the performances there are opportunities to talk to the artisans about traditional puppetry in Việt Nam. The performance is held in the outdoor exhibition space. Special performance for private parties and events can be arranged.



"Becoming a Man Ceremony of the Bamana in Mali"

This exhibition is the result of the cooperation between the Vietnam Museum of Ethnology and two French friends, anthropologist Mrs. Catherine De Clippel and design professor Mr. Patrick Hoarau. This exhibition will display 27 artifacts, 63 photos, 5 movies, and writings. It is meant to introduce viewers to the customs and religions of the Bamana in Mali in West Africa. Masks, worship objects, and real images of festivals, hunters, and the shamans will be selected to portray the important ceremonies of the Bamana men's lives. Ceremonies and custom activities, particularly, the rite of passage to manhood, which is overcome by boys to become men, and the ceremony for proving power to confirm the position of each man, all reflect traditional society in Mali.

"A Little South East Asia"

"A Little South East Asia", an exhibition This exhibition is being held with the desire to help Vietnamese people to learn more about the relationships between Vietnam and other countries in South East Asia, and also to show Vietnam's sense of responsibility for introducing and conserving the area's culture. In fact, the countries in South East Asia are trying to co-operate with each other, so the construction of a South East Asia museum is significant politically and culturally. Also it is meant to discover the similarities and the differences among the countries and minorities within them. The "A Little South East Asia" exhibition is a welcome for the new museum (which is being built) on the grounds of the Vietnam Museum of Ethnology. Costumes from the Philippines and Laos are similar to Vietnam's in their shapes, designs, and materials used. And wooden boxes from Myanmar and wooden trunks from Thailand, host Islamic pictures with the Prophet Salomon, the epic poems Mahabharata and Ramayana, and the lives or people. All these things are in a small space of the exhibition, and viewers will learn more about the countries, people, and the diverse cultures of South East Asia.

The first two floors of the Vietnam National Museum of History house a permanent collection of bronzes, photos, plants, pottery and miscellaneous artifacts, along with a small cafe and shop. At the entrance to the second floor exhibits there is magnificent silk embroidery. The third and fourth floors are still under development but currently display an extensive temporary collection of ceramic pieces from 1000BC to the 20th Century, Đông Sơn drums and both metal and stone tools.



This new museum is completely wheelchair accessible. There is a ramp on the left of the stairs leading to the front door and a circular ramp spirals to each of the four floors. There is also an elevator.

Items are labeled in both Vietnamese and English and are well lit and displayed. Groups are welcome.

"Cultural Heritage of Vietnamese Oceania"

The exhibition displays many rare documents, artifacts, and photos such as archaeological maps of Vietnamese harbours, ancient maps of the spice route, archaeological artifacts from Vân Đồn, the ancient sunken ship Cù Lao Chàm (Hội An), the ancient sunken ship Hòn Dằm (Kiên Giang), maps of Southeast Asia, artifacts such as ceramics, bronzes, and glass collected by domestic and international excavations, and historical domestic and foreign documents related to foreign trade and ocean and islands within the sovereignty of Vietnam. The exhibition is meant to introduce and promote the heritage and various cultures of Vietnamese ocean peoples, as well as to confirm the sovereignty of Vietnam over its ocean and islands. The exhibition introduces 3 periods: the cultural heritage of the Vietnamese ocean from prehistory through the 10th century, the cultural heritage of the Vietnamese ocean from the 11th century through the 18th century, and the cultural heritage of the Vietnamese ocean from the 19th century until now.

1. Bạch Mã Temple Guidebook (White Horse Temple)

Learn about King Lý Thái Tổ's dream and why the temple honors the White Horse Deity. This guidebook offers detailed information on the history of Bạch Mã Temple on Hàng Buồm Street, including temple layout, translation of panels written in Chinese characters, as well as information about the symbolism used in the temple. The guided walk contained at the end of this guidebook provides an opportunity to explore and experience some of the same streets where the craft guilds and merchants set-up within the third enclosure of the citadel.

2. Quán Thánh Temple Guidebook

This publication details the legends of Huyền Thiên Trấn Vũ, also known as the 'genie who guards the Dark Heaven.' This guidebook contains detailed information on the history of Quán Thánh Temple, as well as translations of the many parallel sentences and poems on the walls and columns of this magnificent Taoist Temple. A walking tour of the bronze-casting village of Ngũ Xã, with its Chùa and Đình and the enjoyable atmosphere around Trúc Bạch Lake is included.

3. Trấn Quốc Pagoda Guidebook

The Trấn Quốc Pagoda on Thanh Niên Road was founded some 1400 years ago, and it is one of the most ancient Buddhist pagodas in Hà Nội. Nestled between West Lake and Trúc Bạch Lake, the pagoda is considered a magnificent symbol of Buddhism in Việt Nam, and is one of the most visited sites in the capital. This guidebook covers the history of Buddhism, the temple layout, and describes in detail the different areas of the pagoda. A fascinating publication, which includes especially commissioned drawings and photographs.

4. Phủ Tây Hồ Guidebook (West Lake Palace)

Have you ever wondered who these doll-like statues in glass cabinets, in blue, white, red or green attire may be? Phủ Tây Hồ at the far end of the Tây Hồ peninsula is the most impressive pagoda dedicated to the cult of the Mother goddesses in Hà Nội, an indigenous cult that seems to permeate the lives of all Vietnamese women in varying degrees. The guidebook describes in detail the complex itself, then discusses the religion of the Mother goddesses, including its philosophy, pantheon and rituals.

5. Lãn Ông Street Guidebook (Traditional Medicine Street)

Traditional medicine is very much alive on this particular street of the Old Quarter. This guidebook not only describes the area in its historical context and current set-up, but also offers information on a variety of Vietnamese herbal teas for the health conscious as well as a comprehensive pictorial of Lãn Ông Street.

6. Bát Tràng Traditional Pottery Village: A Self-Guided Walk

This guidebook focuses on the old section of the pottery commune of Bát Tràng, a village with a long history hitherto unknown to many outsiders. The guidebook is based on a self-guided walk. There are three different circuits lasting from 45 minutes to two hours, all shown on a map.

7. Hoàn Kiếm Lake, its Legends and Temples: A Self-Guided Walk

The area around Hồ Hoàn Kiếm represents the physical heart and spiritual soul of Hà Nội. Continuing the tradition of FVH to promote the understanding of Việt Nam's history and culture, this guidebook focuses on the history and legends, the temples and pagodas surrounding the lake. Also included is information on the large Báo Ân Pagoda complex, which was razed between 1886-1889 and left only the Hòa Phong tower still standing today.

8. Vignettes of French Culture in Hà Nội

This guidebook provides an insight and appreciation of the influence on Hà Nội of the French colonial period from 1873 until 1954. The three guided walks contained in this guidebook provide an opportunity for the reader to explore and experience aspects of what the people of Hà Nội have absorbed and made their own as a result of eighty years of French presence in their city.

9. Hồ Tây – Walks Around West Lake

Hồ Tây continues to inspired writers, artists and photographers with its beauty, history, culture and religious aspects, but it also provides for its local residents a source of fish, water and a rich soil to cultivate a variety of plants and vegetables. This guidebook covers the legends of the lake, as well as its history and future plans for this rapidly expanding part of Hà Nội. Included are five self-guided walks identifying those places of interest both old and new around the entire West Lake shore.

10. Văn Miếu Walking Tour (Temple of Literature)

This guidebook introduces visitors to the Văn Miếu, or the Temple of Literature, one of the foremost architectural treasures of Việt Nam and its capital city Hà Nội. The Văn Miếu - Quốc Tử Giám ranks third in Việt Nam's register of national historic sites. A leafy oasis in the centre of the bustling city, it is a magnet for the citizens of Hà Nội and for visitors to the city who wish to spend a quiet moment contemplating its rich past. This guidebook contains a history of the school and the temple, a description of each courtyard and its meaning as expressed through its architecture, translations of all the plaques, as well as quick guides to Confucianism and the Royal Examinations

The Friends of Vietnam Heritage's Resource Center is on the 4th floor of the Hanoi City Library (Thư Viện Hà Nội), located on the corner of Trần Hưng Đạo and Bà Triệu streets. The FVH collection includes books and journals that focus on Vietnamese art, history and culture.

In order to access the collection you need to get a Reader's Card. Go to the office (just inside the main entrance of the library), fill out a simple form, and attach one photograph. You'll also need to show your passport and pay an annual fee of 22,000 VND. After becoming a member, show your card whenever you go in.



The FVH collection is for reference only. You cannot remove the books from the library. Please note that the Reader's Card does not authorize the holder to borrow other books from the main library. If you want a Borrower's Card for checking out non-FVH books, you will need to fill out another form to receive one.

Library Opening Times: Every day Monday to Friday except Thursday morning of the first and third week of the month. Daily times: 8:00 AM – 12:00 PM and 1:30 – 5:00 PM. Closed on weekends and national holidays.
