A Talk by Dr. Mark Rapoport: Shamanism in the Northern Mountains of Vietnam Saturday, 5 October, 10:00 AM – 11:30 AM (English)

Shamanism - the backbone of Tribal Culture. Join us as Mark Rapoport will discuss the tribal groups of Northern Vietnam and the persistence of their shamanisms traditions. The talk will focus on the importance of the old and new artifacts, paintings and ceremonial tools used by the shamans. Mark will also discuss the practice and ethics of being a collector of these fascinating objects.

We have a lot of expertise here. Mark is an avid collector of the tribal art of Vietnam (and Africa). His own substantial collection includes many paintings and tools used by tribal groups residing from Thái Nguyễn to the mountains of the China border. Mark along with business partner Nguyễn Thị Nhung and the 54 Traditions Gallery staff, have assembled and prepared exhibits at two Major - major museums in Hanoi, as well as at the East-West Institute in Honolulu, Hawaii, USA.

A Day with churches in the coastal area of Nam Định province: Phú Nhai Church and Bùi Chu Archbishop's Palace Sunday, 27 October, 7:15 AM – 18:00 PM

95km away from Hanoi, belonging to Red River Delta and spread out along the coast, Nam Định province is one of the areas to which Catholicism was brought to Vietnam in the 17 century. This has made Nam Định famous for many beautiful churches. Our excursion this time will bring you to visit Phú Nhai Church (35km from Nam Định City), which was considered the biggest church in Indochina when it was finished in 1933. We will continue to discover Bùi Chu Archbishop's Palace which is considered one of centres of Vietnam's Catholicism. At the end of the day, on the way back to Hanoi, we will stop at Sở Kiện Church which is greatly influenced by French architecture styles.



The trip will also give us the opportunity to enjoy with beautiful landscapes of Nam Dinh with rice fields, rivers, peaceful villages, and its friendly people.

We aim to arrive back in Hanoi around 6 pm.

#### **Discover Hanoi City Walk:**

Thăng Long to Ba Đình Square: The Political Centre of Vietnam

Saturday, 26 October, Part 1 9:00 AM – 12:00 PM Lunch 12:00 PM – 1:00 PM

Part 2 1:00 PM - 4:00 PM

The old citadel, first built by the Chinese in the late 600s AD, expanded into Thăng Long by the Lý, Trần, and 2 Lê dynasties, then dismantled and moved to Huế by one of the Nguyễns, then subsequently partially rebuilt with French support, then the French domination of Vietnam – the good and the bad, culminating in the defeat of the French by the Vietnamese under the direction of Hồ Chí Minh and Võ Nguyên Giáp, all these are part of this tour.

This walk will take place in 2 parts. In the 1st part, at 9:00am, we'll enter the archaeological dig of Thăng Long Palaces and spend about 45 minutes talking about the development of the site into an imperial



citadel and Forbidden City. We'll then move on to the recently opened citadel where we'll continue to talk about the establishment of Thăng Long and its movement to becoming Hà Nội, and talk about the beginnings of French influence. We'll see some very early French architecture.

At this point, we should be at about 12:00 and we'll take a break for refreshments and lunch at one of the cafes near number 36 Điện Biên Phủ St. We can discuss the French occupation of Indochina.

In the 2nd part, at about 1:00pm, continuing from there both in history and in footwork, we'll make our way past some of the French Colonial villas which now mostly house embassies. We'll talk about the evolution of architecture from Victorian, the reasons for skipping Art Deco, to Indochine, and then the moderne or post-Art-Deco. And lastly, we'll move toward 1954 as we walk past the Hồ Chí Minh Mausoleum and visit the home from which he worked during and after the Revolution (if open). This is both a historical and an architectural tour.

You may participate in either or both parts. The entire tour should end around 4:00pm, but this is not a promise, just a goal.





### Hanoi Museum Bảo Tàng Hà Nôi

Phạm Hùng Street, Từ Liêm

The first two floors of the Vietnam National Museum of History house a permanent collection of bronzes, photos, plants, pottery and miscellaneous artifacts, along with a small cafe and shop. At the entrance to the second floor exhibits there is magnificent silk embroidery. The third and fourth floors are still under development but currently display an extensive temporary collection of ceramic pieces from 1000BC to the 20<sup>th</sup> Century, Đông Sơn drums and both metal and stone tools.

This new museum is completely wheelchair accessible. There is a ramp on the left of the stairs leading to the front door and a circular ramp spirals to each of the four floors. There is also an elevator.



Items are labeled in both Vietnamese and English and are well lit and displayed. Groups are welcome.

#### 1. Bạch Mã Temple Guidebook (White Horse Temple)

Learn about King Lý Thái Tổ's dream and why the temple honors the White Horse Deity. This guidebook offers detailed information on the history of Bạch Mã Temple on Hàng Buồm Street, including temple layout, translation of panels written in Chinese characters, as well as information about the symbolism used in the temple. The guided walk contained at the end of this guidebook provides an opportunity to explore and experience some of the same streets where the craft guilds and merchants set-up within the third enclosure of the citadel.

#### 2. Quán Thánh Temple Guidebook

This publication details the legends of Huyền Thiên Trấn Vũ, also known as the 'genie who guards the Dark Heaven.' This guidebook contains detailed information on the history of Quán Thánh Temple, as well as translations of the many parallel sentences and poems on the walls and columns of this magnificent Taoist Temple. A walking tour of the bronze-casting village of Ngũ Xã, with its Chùa and Đình and the enjoyable atmosphere around Trúc Bạch Lake is included.

#### 3. Trấn Quốc Pagoda Guidebook

The Trấn Quốc Pagoda on Thanh Niên Road was founded some 1400 years ago, and it is one of the most ancient Buddhist pagodas in Hà Nội. Nestled between West Lake and Trúc Bạch Lake, the pagoda is considered a magnificent symbol of Buddhism in Việt Nam, and is one of the most visited sites in the capital. This guidebook covers the history of Buddhism, the temple layout, and describes in detail the different areas of the pagoda. A fascinating publication, which includes especially commissioned drawings and photographs.

#### 4. Phủ Tây Hồ Guidebook (West Lake Palace)

Have you ever wondered who these doll-like statues in glass cabinets, in blue, white, red or green attire may be? Phủ Tây Hồ at the far end of the Tây Hồ peninsula is the most impressive pagoda dedicated to the cult of the Mother goddesses in Hà Nội, an indigenous cult that seems to permeate the lives of all Vietnamese women in varying degrees. The guidebook describes in detail the complex itself, then discusses the religion of the Mother goddesses, including its philosophy, pantheon and rituals.

#### 5. Lãn Ông Street Guidebook (Traditional Medicine Street)

Traditional medicine is very much alive on this particular street of the Old Quarter. This guidebook not only describes the area in its historical context and current set-up, but also offers information on a variety of Vietnamese herbal teas for the health conscious as well as a comprehensive pictorial of Lān Ông Street.

#### 6. Bát Tràng Traditional Pottery Village: A Self-Guided Walk

This guidebook focuses on the old section of the pottery commune of Bát Tràng, a village with a long history hitherto unknown to many outsiders. The guidebook is based on a self-guided walk. There are three different circuits lasting from 45 minutes to two hours, all shown on a map.

#### 7. Hoàn Kiếm Lake, its Legends and Temples: A Self-Guided Walk

The area around Hồ Hoàn Kiếm represents the physical heart and spiritual soul of Hà Nội. Continuing the tradition of FVH to promote the understanding of Việt Nam's history and culture, this guide book focuses on the history and legends, the temples and pagodas surrounding the lake. Also included is information on the large Báo Ân Pagoda complex, which was razed between 1886-1889 and left only the Hòa Phong tower still standing today.

#### 9. Hô Tây - Walks Around West Lake

The FVH collection is for reference only. You cannot remove the books from the library. Please note that the Reader's Card does not authorize the holder to borrow other books from the main library. If you want a Borrower's Card for checking out non-FVH books, you will need to fill out another form to receive one.
