The walk starts at the corner of Nguyễn Du and Trần Bình Trọng, on the pavement by lake Thiền Quang and will continue north through the area where are located a number of private houses built during the 40s-50s by the Vietnamese architects from the Ecole des Beaux-Arts d'Indochine. Some of these old ladies have been perfectly well-kept, other are partly covered by additions of all sorts. Most of them reflect the innovation of the period with creations inspired by the modernist movement and adopting Indochinese motifs.

Discover Hanoi City Walk:

The Evolution of Colonial Style Architecture

Saturday, 11 April, 10:00 AM - 12:00 PM

(English)

Our walk starts in Lý Thái Tổ Park next to the old post office - the heart of the French colony during the first decades of the 20th Century. From there we will walk towards the Opera House and down towards the School of Pharmacy, originally the University of Hanoi, designed by French architect Ernest Hebrard. Following the wide, tree-lined boulevards of Lý Thường Kiệt and Trần Hưng Đạo we will trace the evolution of French colonial style architecture from the turn of the century to the end of the French era in the 1940's.

In this walk we will discover Lăn Ông Street which is well-known for herbal medicine. A number of herbs and materials will be shown along the street including longan, lotus seeds, and the mysterious so-called "snake wine", to name but a few. We will also tour several nearby streets with notable architecture, religious buildings and history around the area including Chả Cá Street with its 100-year-old famous fish noodle restaurant.

Hard Rails Across A Gentle River (2010) is probably the best 45 minute cultural tour of this city you'll ever have. It brings together four short-documentaries on the iconic Long Bien bridge area by different Vietnamese film-makers from Hanoi DOCLAB. We chat with vendors, laugh a little at tourists, get our kit off with the naked swimmers (if you haven't heard, it's a thing). In the evening, we spy on kissing couples - from a safe distance. We talk with the people of this city and see what makes them tick. And in doing so, the city - or at least one important part of it - starts to *make sense*. A precious gift for all us *người nước ngoài*.



We don't say this lightly, but for long-term Hanoi residents, this is a must-see.

Cúc Phương National Park and Hồ Citadel – the World Heritage of Vietnam

Saturday, 18 April, 8:00 AM – Sunday, 19 April, 05:00 PM

Day 1 - Saturday, 18 Apr 2015

8 am: Start from the Sofitel Plaza Hotel. Drive via Highway 1 southward for approximately 150 km. This will take about 3 hours to Vĩnh Lộc Town. We will stop along the way to visit Song Temple which worships the three Queen Mothers.

12 noon: Arrive at Vĩnh Lộc Town for lunch in the local restaurant.

1 pm: Continue on for a short drive and walk to visit the Hồ Citadel. This World Heritage site has been built from thousands of huge stone blocks. While there we will visit the small museum, walk on the wall of the citadel with a climb on top of the stone gates. We continue on to visit Bình Khương Temple and Tây Giai, a 400 year old ancient house nearby.

4 pm: 4.00 pm leave the site and drive 1 hour to Cúc Phương National Park.

5 pm: Check in at Guest House of Cúc Phương National Park.

7 pm: having dinner at the Restaurant of the guest house.

Day 2 - Sunday, 19 Apr 2015

8 am: Morning refresh and breakfast in the Guest House, Check out.

9 am: visit the Animal Rescue and Conservation Center of mammals, reptiles and amphibians in Cúc Phương National Park.

10.30 am: drive more and go checking in the forest visit Người Xưa Cave, Trò 1000 years' old banyan tree.

1 pm: back to the Guest House Restaurant and have lunch.

2.30 pm: drive back to Hanoi.

5 pm: arrive back to Hanoi - End of the trip.

The first two floors of the Vietnam National Museum of History house a permanent collection of bronzes, photos, plants, pottery and miscellaneous artifacts, along with a small cafe and shop. At the entrance to the second floor exhibits there is magnificent silk embroidery. The third and fourth floors are still under development but currently display an extensive temporary collection of ceramic pieces from 1000BC to the 20th Century, Đông Sơn drums and both metal and stone tools.

This new museum is completely wheelchair accessible. There is a ramp on the left of the stairs leading to the front door and a circular ramp spirals to each of the four floors. There is also an elevator.



Items are labeled in both Vietnamese and English and are well lit and displayed. Groups are welcome.

1. Bạch Mã Temple Guidebook (White Horse Temple)

Learn about King Lý Thái Tổ's dream and why the temple honors the White Horse Deity. This guidebook offers detailed information on the history of Bạch Mã Temple on Hàng Buồm Street, including temple layout, translation of panels written in Chinese characters, as well as information about the symbolism used in the temple. The guided walk contained at the end of this guidebook provides an opportunity to explore and experience some of the same streets where the craft guilds and merchants set-up within the third enclosure of the citadel.

2. Quán Thánh Temple Guidebook

This publication details the legends of Huyền Thiên Trấn Vũ, also known as the 'genie who guards the Dark Heaven.' This guidebook contains detailed information on the history of Quán Thánh Temple, as well as translations of the many parallel sentences and poems on the walls and columns of this magnificent Taoist Temple. A walking tour of the bronze-casting village of Ngũ Xá, with its Chùa and Đình and the enjoyable atmosphere around Trúc Bạch Lake is included.

3. Trấn Quốc Pagoda Guidebook

The Trấn Quốc Pagoda on Thanh Niên Road was founded some 1400 years ago, and it is one of the most ancient Buddhist pagodas in Hà Nội. Nestled between West Lake and Trúc Bạch Lake, the pagoda is considered a magnificent symbol of Buddhism in Việt Nam, and is one of the most visited sites in the capital. This guidebook covers the history of Buddhism, the temple layout, and describes in detail the different areas of the pagoda. A fascinating publication, which includes especially commissioned drawings and photographs.

4. Phủ Tây Hồ Guidebook (West Lake Palace)

Have you ever wondered who these doll-like statues in glass cabinets, in blue, white, red or green attire may be? Phủ Tây Hồ at the far end of the Tây Hồ peninsula is the most impressive pagoda dedicated to the cult of the Mother goddesses in Hà Nội, an indigenous cult that seems to permeate the lives of all Vietnamese women in varying degrees. The guidebook describes in detail the complex itself, then discusses the religion of the Mother goddesses, including its philosophy, pantheon and rituals.

5. Lãn Ông Street Guidebook (Traditional Medicine Street)

Traditional medicine is very much alive on this particular street of the Old Quarter. This guidebook not only describes the area in its historical context and current set-up, but also offers information on a variety of Vietnamese herbal teas for the health conscious as well as a comprehensive pictorial of Lãn Ông Street.

6. Bát Tràng Traditional Pottery Village: A Self-Guided Walk

This guidebook focuses on the old section of the pottery commune of Bát Tràng, a village with a long history hitherto unknown to many outsiders. The guidebook is based on a self-guided walk. There are three different circuits lasting from 45 minutes to two hours, all shown on a map.

7. Hoàn Kiếm Lake, its Legends and Temples: A Self-Guided Walk

The area around Hồ Hoàn Kiếm represents the physical heart and spiritual soul of Hà Nội. Continuing the tradition of FVH to promote the understanding of Việt Nam's history and culture, this guidebook focuses on the history and legends, the temples and pagodas surrounding the lake. Also included is information on the large Báo Ân Pagoda complex, which was razed between 1886-1889 and left only the Hòa Phong tower still standing today.

8. Vignettes of French Culture in Hà Nội

This guidebook provides an insight and appreciation of the influence on Hà Nội of the French colonial period from 1873 until 1954. The three guided walks contained in this guidebook provide an opportunity for the reader to explore and experience aspects of what the people of Hà Nội have absorbed and made their own as a result of eighty years of French presence in their city.

9. Hồ Tây – Walks Around West Lake

Hồ Tây continues to inspired writers, artists and photographers with its beauty, history, culture and religious aspects, but it also provides for its local residents a source of fish, water and a rich soil to cultivate a variety of plants and vegetables. This guidebook covers the legends of the lake, as well as its history and future plans for this rapidly expanding part of Hà Nội. Included are five self-guided walks identifying those places of interest both old and new around the entire West Lake shore.

10. Văn Miếu Walking Tour (Temple of Literature)

This guidebook introduces visitors to the Văn Miếu, or the Temple of Literature, one of the foremost architectural treasures of Việt Nam and its capital city Hà Nội. The Văn Miếu - Quốc Tử Giám ranks third in Việt Nam's register of national historic sites. A leafy oasis in the centre of the bustling city, it is a magnet for the citizens of Hà Nội and for visitors to the city who wish to spend a quiet moment contemplating its rich past. This guidebook contains a history of the school and the temple, a description of each courtyard and its meaning as expressed through its architecture, translations of all the plaques, as well as quick guides to Confucianism and the Royal Examinations

You'll also need to show your passport and pay an annual fee of 22,000 VND. After becoming a member, show your card whenever you go in.



The FVH collection is for reference only. You cannot remove the books from the library. Please note that the Reader's Card does not authorize the holder to borrow other books from the main library. If you want a Borrower's Card for checking out non-FVH books, you will need to fill out another form to receive one.

Library Opening Times: Every day Monday to Friday except Thursday morning of the first and third week of the month. Daily times: 8:00 AM – 12:00 PM and 1:30 – 5:00 PM. Closed on weekends and national holidays.
