Program Details

Discover Hanoi City Walk: The Evolution of Colonial Style Architecture Sunday, 03 May, 10:00 AM - 12:00 PM (English)

Our walk starts in Lý Thái Tổ Park next to the old post office - the heart of the French colony during the first decades of the 20th Century. From there we will walk towards the Opera House and down towards the School of Pharmacy, originally the University of Hanoi, designed by French architect Ernest Hebrard. Following the wide, tree-lined boulevards of Lý Thường Kiệt and Trần Hưng Đạo we will trace the evolution of French colonial style architecture from the turn of the century to the end of the French era in the 1940's.

<u>Music & Performance:</u> Vietnam's Traditional Performances Friday, 08 May, 7:45 PM – 10:00 PM

Join us for a journey of the musical history and traditions of Hanoi. The show replicates the footsteps of the city's music through history, using traditional voices, rhythms, and beats combined with contemporary installation arts. The performances will be made by several well-known People's Artists, singers, and musicians. The following traditional music and singing styles will be included in the performance: **The Hát Quan Ho** – an alternative form of singing



originating in Bắc Ninh in northern Vietnam in the 18th century. **The Chèo** - a form of folk theater in North Vietnam, featuring lyrical playfulness with conventional high style and simple lyrics with rhythmic richness. **The Châu Văn** – a form of ritual music, rich in melody and rhythmic structure, for the worship of the Mother Goddesses, a shamanistic religion of Vietnam. **The Cái Lương** - originating in southern Vietnam, this art form has thrived since the 1940s. **The Ca Trù** - recognized as an Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity by UNESCO, Ca trù was developed in the Royal Court at the time of Lý dynasty (from the 11th to 13th century). Ca trù is a ritual chant of refined poetry for scholars and mandarins. **The Hát Tuồng** – a form of ancient theater which originated in China and came to Vietnam in the 13th century. The theatrical techniques include martial arts and circus, accompanied by singing and music. **The Hát Xẩm** – a musical style originally played by blind beggars in marketplaces and buses, whose accompanying songs are about human morality and ironic satires about life.

<u>Excursion:</u> Kinh Bắc Heritages and countryside Sunday, 10 May, 8:00 AM – 5:30 PM *(English)*

8.00 am:

- Drive Đình Bảng Communal House The biggest Communal House in Bắc Ninh Province ,
- then continue to Phật Tích Pagoda, the capital of Buddhism during Lý Dynasty, also called the Buddha Legend Pagoda on the hill side. We will then walk to the ferry crossing at the Duong River and walk through the mulberry fields whose leaves are used for growing the silk worm.
- Visit Bút Tháp Pagoda, a gem of Vietnam traditional architecture with its famous stone carving pictures on the handrails and its lacquer-ware painted statues.



• Continuing our drive along the Đuống River to Đông Hồ the traditional rice paper, wood carving and print making village. We will also stop to visit with an artist in his home.

12.30 am: Drive to Hồ Town and have lunch on your own at local restaurant in Hồ Town

- Then drive on to Xuân Lai, the bamboo village, which specializes in making bamboo furniture to see and learn the different processes of how to prepare the bamboo, form to different shapes to make the furniture and the finishing process
- Continue to visit Diềm Village in Bắc Ninh City, the homeland of Quan Họ traditional song. Walk through the complex of this typical Quan Họ Village, to see its pond for singing, its temple, pagoda, communal house.
- 2.00 pm Drive through Đông Xuyên town and then turn to Đong Anh district to visit Sái Taoism Temple, the temple dedicated to the God of Starts and considered the founder of Taoism in Vietnam and who helped the King build the Cổ Loa Snail Citadel. This temple is situated upon a small hill surrounded by rice paddy fields.

Day 1

8 am : Start form Sofitel Plaza Hotel and drive along the Red River dike to Phố Hiến in Hưng Yên Province. 1.30 pm Continue our drive to Thái Bình City stopping to turn to visit the famous Keo Pagoda, the masterpiece of Vietnam traditional architecture. It's surrounded by a water pond situated in the rice fields and this may be the largest ancient wooden Pagoda in Vietnam still standing today.

3.00 pm Drive back to Thái Bình City and turn to Nam Định City, follow the road East to the seacoast and arrive in the Xuân Thủy National Park.

4.30 pm Check into the National Park Guest House and then a short tour to admire some of the many difference kinds of water birds that will be returning back to their nest in the late afternoon. This is where many bird lovers from all over the world come for bird watching.

7.00 pm Dinner at the guest house with local sea food on the menu.

Day 2

07.00 am Breakfast in the Hotel with time for walking around to enjoy the landscape of the island.

09.00 am Checkout and drive back to Nam Định City to visit Cổ Lễ Pagoda, Phổ Minh's famous Pagoda and then Trần temple on the way. Drive via Highway 10 to Hải Phòng City, stop to see the Vĩnh Bảo tobacco farm along the way.

The first two floors of the Vietnam National Museum of History house a permanent collection of bronzes, photos, plants, pottery and miscellaneous artifacts, along with a small cafe and shop. At the entrance to the second floor exhibits there is magnificent silk embroidery. The third and fourth floors are still under development but currently display an extensive temporary collection of ceramic pieces from 1000BC to the 20th Century, Dông Sơn drums and both metal and stone tools.

This new museum is completely wheelchair accessible. There is a ramp on the left of the stairs leading to the front door and a circular ramp spirals to each of the four floors. There is also an elevator.



Items are labeled in both Vietnamese and English and are well lit and displayed. Groups are welcome.

1. Bạch Mã Temple Guidebook (White Horse Temple)

Learn about King Lý Thái Tổ's dream and why the temple honors the White Horse Deity. This guidebook offers detailed information on the history of Bach Mã Temple on Hàng Buồm Street, including temple layout, translation of panels written in Chinese characters, as well as information about the symbolism used in the temple. The guided walk contained at the end of this guidebook provides an opportunity to explore and experience some of the same streets where the craft guilds and merchants set-up within the third enclosure of the citadel.

2. Quán Thánh Temple Guidebook

This publication details the legends of Huyền Thiên Trấn Vũ, also known as the 'genie who guards the Dark Heaven.' This guidebook contains detailed information on the history of Quán Thánh Temple, as well as translations of the many parallel sentences and poems on the walls and columns of this magnificent Taoist Temple. A walking tour of the bronze-casting village of Ngũ Xã, with its Chùa and Đình and the enjoyable atmosphere around Trúc Bạch Lake is included. **Published 2002, reprinted 2008**

3. Trấn Quốc Pagoda Guidebook

The Trấn Quốc Pagoda on Thanh Niên Road was founded some 1400 years ago, and it is one of the most ancient Buddhist pagodas in Hà Nội. Nestled between West Lake and Trúc Bạch Lake, the pagoda is considered a magnificent symbol of Buddhism in Việt Nam, and is one of the most visited sites in the capital. This guidebook covers the history of Buddhism, the temple layout, and describes in detail the different areas of the pagoda. A fascinating publication, which includes especially commissioned drawings and photographs.

4. Phủ Tây Hồ Guidebook (West Lake Palace)

Have you ever wondered who these doll-like statues in glass cabinets, in blue, white, red or green attire may be? Phủ Tây Hồ at the far end of the Tây Hồ peninsula is the most impressive pagoda dedicated to the cult of the Mother goddesses in Hà Nội, an indigenous cult that seems to permeate the lives of all Vietnamese women in varying degrees. The guidebook describes in detail the complex itself, then discusses the religion of the Mother goddesses, including its philosophy, pantheon and rituals.

5. Lãn Ông Street Guidebook (Traditional Medicine Street)

Traditional medicine is very much alive on this particular street of the Old Quarter. This guidebook not only describes the area in its historical context and current set-up, but also offers information on a variety of Vietnamese herbal teas for the health conscious as well as a comprehensive pictorial of Lãn Ông Street. **Published 2005, reprinted 2005**



6. Bát Tràng Traditional Pottery Village: A Self-Guided Walk

This guidebook focuses on the old section of the pottery commune of Bát Tràng, a village with a long history hitherto unknown to many outsiders. The guidebook is based on a self-guided walk. There are three different circuits lasting from 45 minutes to two hours, all shown on a map. *Published 2006, reprinted 2009*

7. Hoàn Kiếm Lake, its Legends and Temples: A Self-Guided Walk

The area around Hồ Hoàn Kiếm represents the physical heart and spiritual soul of Hà Nội. Continuing the tradition of FVH to promote the understanding of Việt Nam's history and culture, this guidebook focuses on the history and legends, the temples and pagodas surrounding the lake. Also included is information on the large Báo Ân Pagoda complex, which was razed between 1886-1889 and left only the Hòa Phong tower still standing today. **Published 2007**

8. Vignettes of French Culture in Hà Nội

This guidebook provides an insight and appreciation of the influence on Hà Nội of the French colonial period from 1873 until 1954. The three guided walks contained in this guidebook provide an opportunity for the reader to explore and experience aspects of what the people of Hà Nội have absorbed and made their own as a result of eighty years of French presence in their city. **Published 2008**

9. Hồ Tây – Walks Around West Lake

Hồ Tây continues to inspired writers, artists and photographers with its beauty, history, culture and religious aspects, but it also provides for its local residents a source of fish, water and a rich soil to cultivate a variety of plants and vegetables. This guidebook covers the legends of the lake, as well as its history and future plans for this rapidly expanding part of Hà Nội. Included are five self-guided walks identifying those places of interest both old and new around the entire West Lake shore.

10. Văn Miếu Walking Tour (Temple of Literature)

This guidebook introduces visitors to the Văn Miếu, or the Temple of Literature, one of the foremost architectural treasures of Việt Nam and its capital city Hà Nội. The Văn Miếu - Quốc Tử Giám ranks third in Việt Nam's register of national historic sites. A leafy oasis in the centre of the bustling city, it is a magnet for the citizens of Hà Nội and for visitors to the city who wish to spend a quiet moment contemplating its rich past. This guidebook contains a history of the school and the temple, a description of each courtyard and its meaning as expressed through its architecture, translations of all the plaques, as well as quick guides to Confucianism and the Royal Examinations

The Friends of Vietnam Heritage's Resource Center is on the 4th floor of the Hanoi City Library (Thư Viện Hà Nội), located on the corner of Trần Hưng Đạo and Bà Triệu streets. The FVH collection includes books and journals that focus on Vietnamese art, history and culture.

In order to access the collection you need to get a Reader's Card. Go to the office (just inside the main entrance of the library), fill out a simple form, and attach one photograph. You'll also need to show your passport and pay an annual fee of 22,000 VND. After becoming a member, show your card whenever you go in.



The FVH collection is for reference only. You cannot remove the books from the library. Please note that the Reader's Card does not authorize the holder to borrow other books from the main library.
